Study materials - All students to bring notebooks, writing equipment and textbooks currently in use for your own grammar, examination, conversation or study. All necessary study sheets will be provided by the tutors. Note: Extra equipment will be available for those students who are new to the study. International and interstate students will be provided with a dictionary and calligraphy board. Linen and towels will be supplied for all international and interstate students.
